There are four **Walden III Memorial Scholarships** available for students to apply for. They are as follows:

## **JEROME KAMIN MEMORIAL AWARD**

- The award shall be granted to a 12<sup>th</sup> grade student who is an avid and broad area reader.
- Nominees will submit their ROPE bibliography and book reports to the Kamin Committee.
- A committee consisting of one English teacher, the HS Coordinator, and one volunteer will review the nominees and make the award.
- The recipient will receive a gift certificate for the purchase of books, be recognized as the “Kamin Reader of the Year”, and have his/her name engraved on the Kamin Plaque located in the main hall.

## **SARAH LAJINESS CREATIVE WRITING AWARD**

- The Sarah Lajiness Creative Writing Award encourages original writings.
- Students may submit up to three pieces in the following categories:  
    Play, Poetry, Short Story or Essay

    - c. This commitment could be demonstrated by such things as private lessons, formal study of theory, participation in performance groups, and the entering of competitions.
    - d. Intend to use the award to further develop this talent.
  2. **Secondary Qualities:** The recipient should show a balance of the following qualities:
    - a. Ability and academic achievement consistent with formal study of music beyond high school.
    - b. A positive contributor to the overall Walden III community beyond normal class work and expected musical performance.
    - c. A person who demonstrates other qualities prized by Walden III. Among these are:  
    Concern for others, personal dignity and maturity, courage, self-motivation, curiosity and a desire to learn, and positive risk-taking.
